Prayer of Penitence & Lament

Creative Prayer Ideas

Field to Fork Prayer Chain

This simple prayer activity helps you trace the journey of your food from field to fork. You will need strips of paper, pens or pencils and glue sticks.

In advance of your gathering or service, choose some common food items and identify where they are grown. You could ask your community to do this by collecting labels showing countries of origin from their weekly shop.

Invite people to write on strips of paper a sentence expressing their hopes for those who grow our food in each country. Take a moment to hold that hope before God, praying aloud or in silence. Each person should now loop and glue together their strip to make the first link of a paper chain.

Continue this with more strips of paper, inviting those present to write down their hopes for:

- Those who transport food.
- Those who deliver food to warehouses and supermarkets.
- Staff at your local supermarket and food shops, as well as those who deliver food to our doors.
- Those who cook for us and share meals with us.

On the final strip of paper ask those gathered to express their hopes in the face of the problems affecting global food supplies. These include poverty, conflict, and the climate crisis. Pray together for action to end poverty, bring peace and tackle the climate emergency.

A Harvest Meditation

The earth is fruitful; may we see God's generosity in nature. The earth is fragile; may we hear God's call to be good shepherds. The earth is fractured; may we cry out for justice and in the Lord's name.











HOPE prayers

Mark your Harvest of Hope by praying for:



Home

Pray for causes close to home, such as your local foodbank and people experiencing poverty in your community. Pray for yourself, your family and friends, that God may guide you as you take action for a more just world.



Our Neighbours

Remembering our calling to love our neighbours as ourselves, pray for our global neighbours in places like Zimbabwe. Pray for those who are enduring the greatest impacts of the climate crisis.

Power

Pray for those who hold political and economic power that they would act to tackle food insecurity and the causes of the climate crisis. Pray for those excluded from power, that they will no longer be marginalised.





Pray for those working to repair and heal the harm we have done to the natural world. Pray for projects sharing environmentally sustainable farming techniques. Pray for environmental causes close to your heart.

Everything is Yours

Washed Away, New Growth

For this activity you will need pencils, a large wide bowl filled with water, a seed, a pot, some compost, and some sheets of water soluble paper (available to purchase online; note that water soluble paper is different from rice paper).



Whilst many farmers in countries such as Zimbabwe are struggling with drought, elsewhere the climate crisis makes floods more likely and leads to greater areas of land becoming flood-prone. This prayer activity offers a representation of the losses that the climate crisis leads to, as well as a sign of hope for change.

Cut your water soluble paper into small rectangles and ask those gathered to write on it a word or phrase of lament with their pencils. This could be a personal expression of sorrow or repentance or an expression of how they feel when they see extreme weather and environmental disasters happening around the world.

Invite each person to place their paper into the bowl of water. As the paper dissolves pray for all those whose homes, crops, livelihoods and hopes have been washed away or otherwise destroyed. Keep a moment of silence.

Now take your pot, fill it with compost and plant your seed. Water the pot from the bowl in which your paper has dissolved. Any remaining paper will biodegrade into the soil.

As you water the soil, pray for the restoration of what can be restored and for the healing of the earth. You may want to use one of the following passages:

Sow for yourselves righteousness; reap steadfast love; break up your fallow ground, for it is time to seek the Lord, that he may come and rain righteousness upon you. (Hosea 10.12)

May those who sow in tears reap with shouts of joy. (Psalm 126.5)
